<p>Pre-Registration Procedures</p>	<p>Beginning on September 1, 2009, all GED candidates are required to complete the online GED Demographic Form before coming to the test center to register to take the GED tests.</p> <p>The GED Demographic Form is a method for GED test-takers to create their own online record in The University of Texas at Austin (UT) GED database.</p> <p>Please log on to the following website to create your access to The University of Texas system and start your own online demographic record as a GED test-taker. <p>Registration Schedule</p>	<p>Any school day from August 19, 2010 through May 13, 2011. Hours: 9:00 – 3:00 No appointment needed.</p>
<p>Testing Fees</p>	<p><u>All fees must be paid at registration with a money order made out to Frisco ISD. Fees are non-refundable!</u> \$90.00 for initial test \$20.00 per test retake \$20.00 reschedule fee per test</p>

<p>Registration Requirements</p>	<p>All applicants must be a resident of Texas or a member of the U.S. Armed Forces stationed at a Texas installation.</p> <p>Applicants who are 17 years of age must provide:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Official withdrawal from school last attended. 2. Official State Consent Form, signed by parent or guardian. 3. Government issued ID that includes the following: Date of Birth, Photograph, Address and Signature (NO EXCEPTIONS). 4. Social Security Card or Birth Certificate. 5. Money order for test fee. <p>Applicants who are 18 years of age or older must provide:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Government ID that includes the following: Date of Birth, Photograph, Address and Signature (NO EXCEPTIONS). 2. Social Security Card or Birth Certificate. 3. Money order for test fee. 												
<p>Retesting Information</p>	<p>Candidates who are re-testing must bring the items required for registration (Listed Above) and a copy of their GED test results. If it has been less than 6 months since your last test, the Texas Education Agency requires that you bring a waiver/letter from your GED instructor before re-testing.</p>												
<p>English</p>	<p>GED tests are available in English and adaptations to testing conditions are available with documented disabilities.</p>												
<p>Test Length</p>	<p>The five-part GED Test is administered in two morning sessions. Each section will only be offered at the specified time/day below: GED Test takers must arrive by 8:00 a.m. on test day.</p>

<p>Directions to Testing Center</p>	<p>The Student Opportunity Center is located at 6928 Maple Street. Turn north on Fourth Street from Main Street. Go three blocks to Maple Street. The Student Opportunity Center is identified by large flag poles in front.</p>
<p>Test Description</p>	<p>The GED exam is comprised of 5 sections:</p> <p>Language Arts, Writing - 50 questions & essay – 120 minutes Mathematics – 50 questions – 90 minutes Science – 50 questions – 80 minutes Social Studies – 50 questions – 70 minutes Language Arts, Reading – 40 questions – 65 minutes</p>
<p>Test Results</p>	<p>The entire GED exam is scored in Austin by the University of Texas. The Texas Education Agency will mail your results/certificate directly to you in approximately 3-4 weeks.</p>
<p>Want to Study for the GED Exam?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. GED Preparation Classes are offered to adults living in the Frisco School District. They are held Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:00 – 9:00 p.m. These classes are free of charge. 2. Buy a GED Study Guide available at area bookstores.
