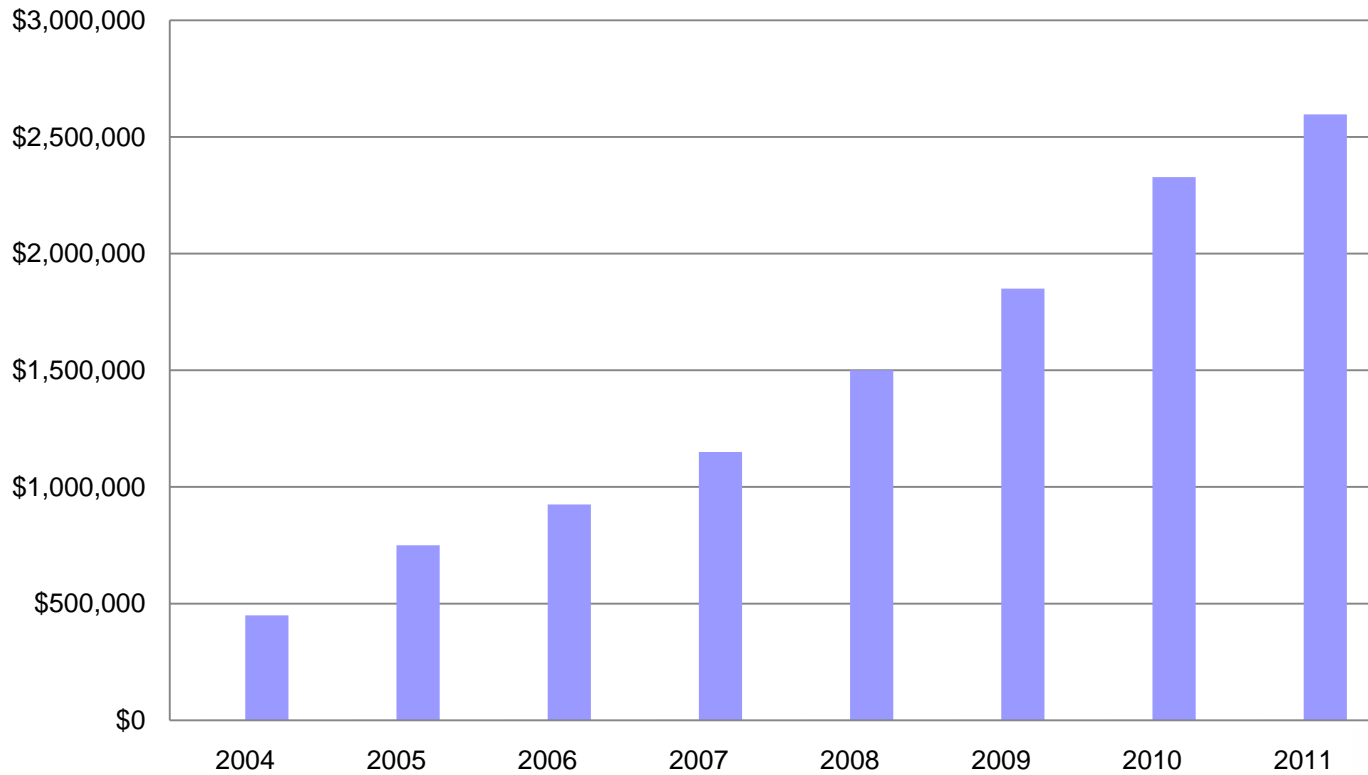

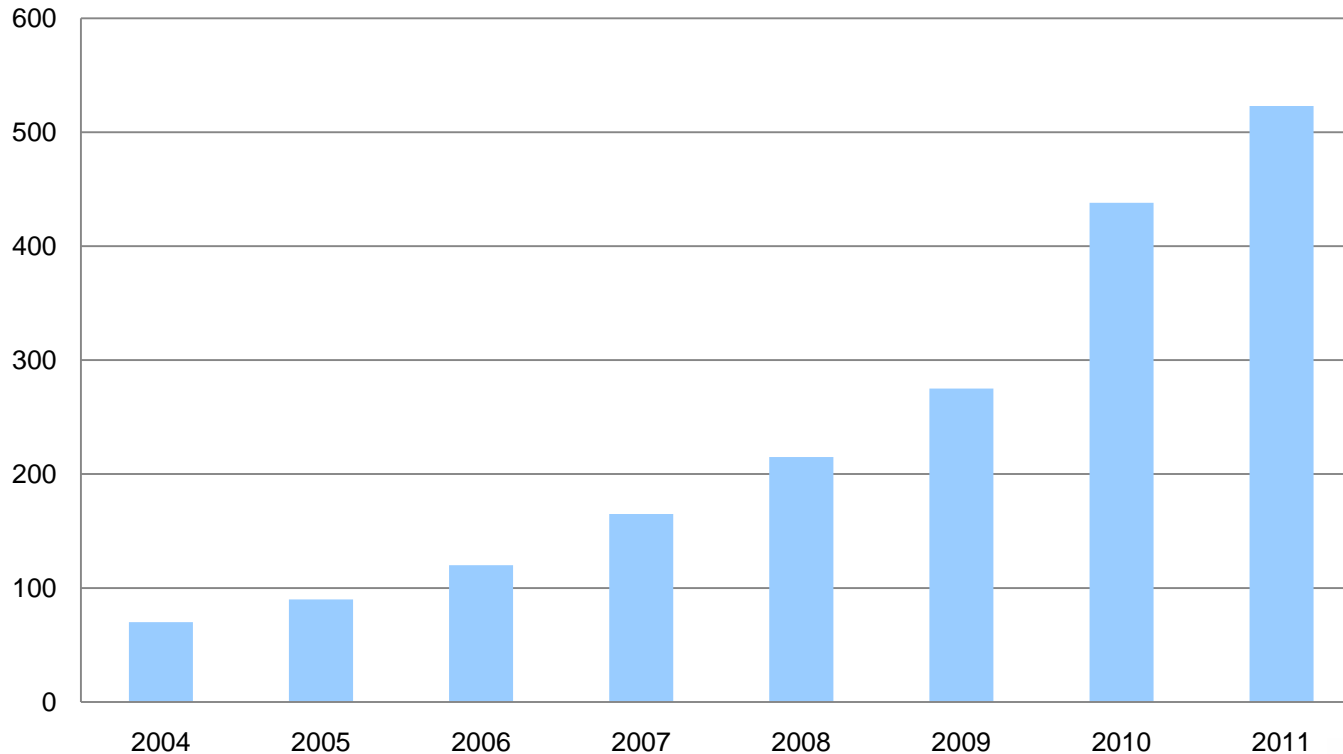

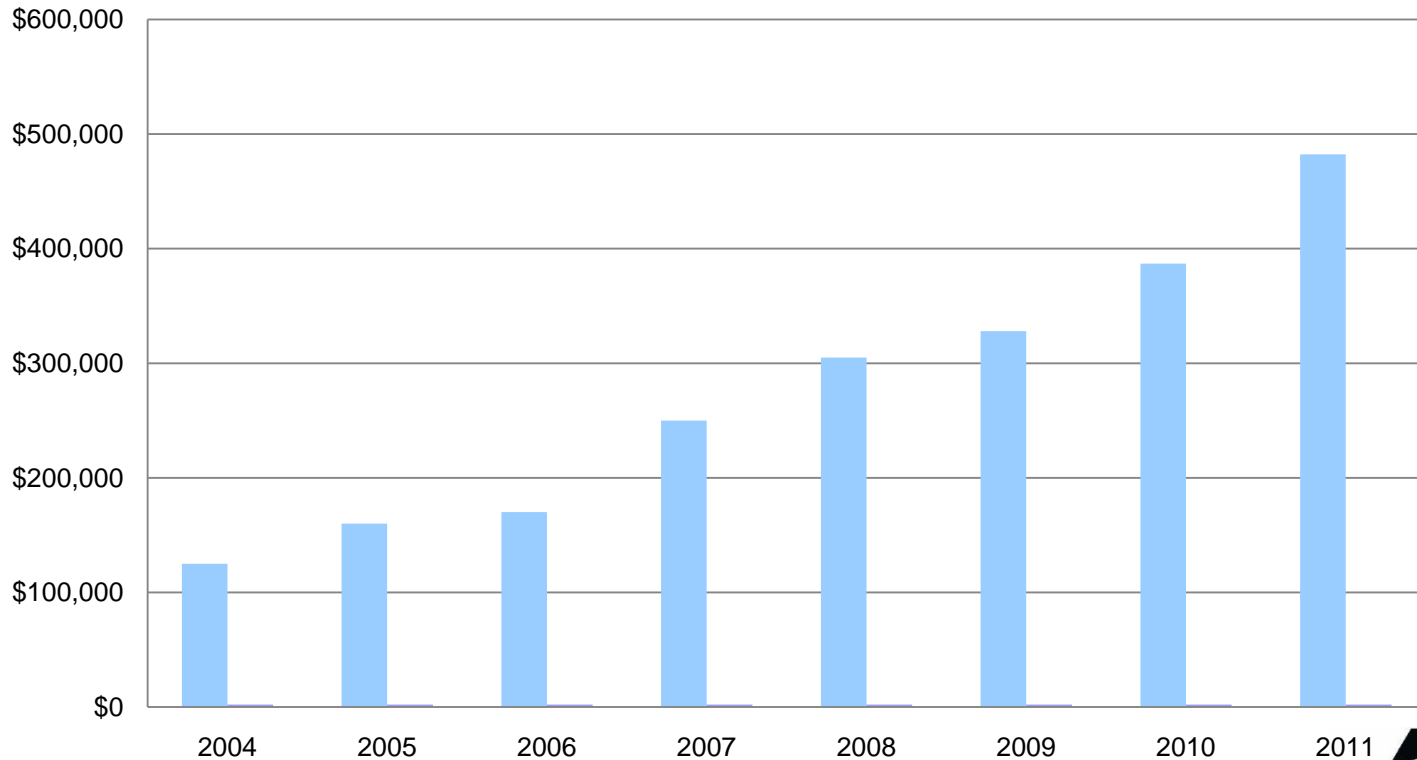
Number of Scholarship Recipients by Year

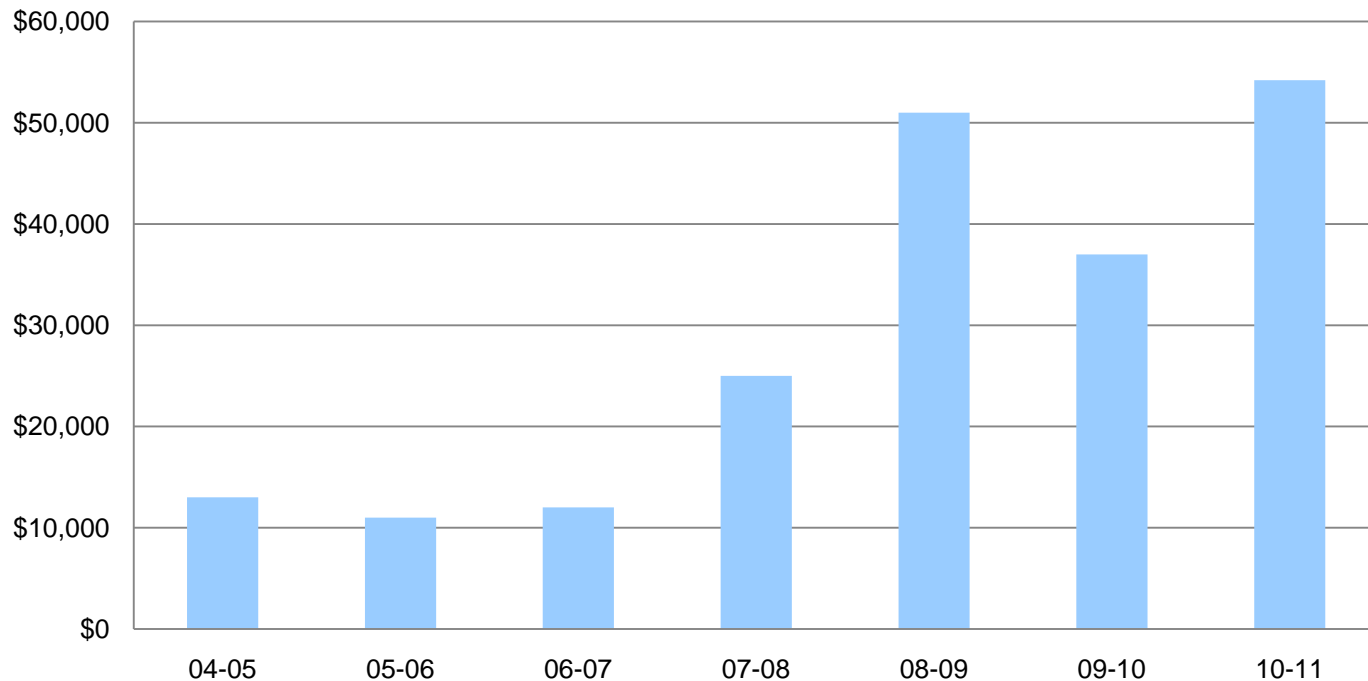
