**RESOLUTION CONCERNING HIGH STAKES, STANDARDIZED TESTING
OF TEXAS PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS**

WHEREAS, standardized, high stakes testing is strangling our public schools and undermining any chance that educators have to transform a traditional system of schooling into an educational opportunity that prepares our students to be competitive on a global stage; and

WHEREAS, Frisco Independent School District (FISD), a high-performing school district located in the north Texas area, unanimously joins Robert Scott, Commissioner of the Texas Education Agency, in his concern about the overemphasis on high stakes testing and in his continuing support of high standards and local accountability; and

WHEREAS, FISD agrees with Bill Hammond, President of the Texas Association of Business, who trenchantly observed that “[i]f we do not deliver a quality education system that prepares our students for college and careers, Texas’ ability to attract new business, improve our economy and maintain our competitiveness will surely falter. Our very prosperity as a state, its business and its people stands in the balance” and

WHEREAS, FISD disagrees with the idea that the path to success for all students is through more standardized tests and strongly believes that introducing more tests that require students to memorize and fill out bubble answer sheets as a condition of graduation will continue to keep school districts from being able to reach the very goals upon which all Texans agree; and

WHEREAS, the real work of delivering a quality education begins by changing what occurs in our classrooms every day; and

WHEREAS, we believe in the tenets of *Creating a New Vision for Public Education in Texas* and are working to transform this district through many means including participation in the newly formed Texas Visioning Network through the Texas Association of School Administrators; and

WHEREAS, our vision is for all students to be engaged in relevant learning activities that provide for student choice and we embrace the concept that students can be more than consumers of knowledge; and

WHEREAS, only by creating classrooms that foster and celebrate innovation, creativity, problem solving skills, collaboration, communication, and critical thinking will we actually make progress toward the very skills that business leaders such as the Texas Association of Business desire in a rising workforce; and

WHEREAS, imposing relentless test preparation and boring memorization of facts to enhance test performance is doing little more than stealing the love of learning from our students and assuring that we fall short of our goals; and

WHEREAS, we do not oppose accountability in public schools and point with pride to the stellar performance of our students on every test the state has developed, but believe that the system of the past will not prepare our students to lead in the future and neither will the standardized tests that so dominate their instructional time and block our ability to make progress toward a world-class education system of student-centered schools with future-ready students; therefore be it

RESOLVED that the FISH calls on the Texas Legislature to reexamine the accountability system in Texas and to develop a system that truly measures student learning against rigorous standards that will prepare them for their global futures and without undermining the fundamental principles of good teaching or destroying students' innate love of learning.
