Assess and Make a List


- Use a skills inventory to identify tasks
- Identify what is not working for your family
- Prioritize





Make a Plan

- Know your child's learning seasons
 - Developmentally
 - Chronologically
 - Maturity



Molly will clear the table after dinner every night. She will then get to read a book with a parent for 10 minutes.

Johnny will brush his teeth before bed every night. A parent will scratch Johnny's back in bed for 10 minutes.

Teach the Skills Needed

- Prepare the Environment
- Be positive and have fun!
- Use strategies listed below or come up with your own:

Modeling (parent, video, peer) Break skills down as needed Backwards chaining Use visuals Social Scripts



Closely Monitor and Reinforce

- Start with immediate reinforcement
- Gradually decrease reinforcement until child is intrinsically motivated
- Re-assess as needed...don't forget! You may have to go back to the drawing board.



























The Magic of Creativity
