Finance, presented an update on

demographics, current projects

and planning for future schools.

He showed that growth is

continuing, with more than 3,000

new students anticipated in 2008-

2009, putting the district at over

the 30,000 mark. In looking at

districts with between 10-20,000

students in the years 1995-2005,

FISD was the fastest growing in

the nation by more than 300

percent, growing 638 percent

during that time. We are currently

building the fifth and sixth high

schools with the fifth (Heritage)

planned to open in 2009 with 9th

and 10th graders and the sixth

(Lone Star) to most likely open in

2010 with grades 9-11. The 8th

and 9th middle schools (Scoggins

and Stafford) will open this fall

and two more will probably be

needed in 2010 to relieve Roach

and Pioneer Heritage. Griffin will

most likely again need relief in

2011. The 26th and 27th

elementary schools (Tadlock and

Elliott) are opening this fall and

an Early Childhood School and

Allen Elementary will open in

2009. Another elementary may be

needed, but that decision has not

been made at this time. The

Career and Technical Education

Center will also open this fall. In

looking out our unique

partnerships and how we benefit,

he showed the schematic for the

Deja Blue arena expansion

scheduled for completion in 2009.
