AEIS 2006-2007

Dr. Nelson discussed the AEIS report that is based on the PEIMS data that districts submit annually as part of the state's accountability system. The district received gold performance acknowledgements in reading, math, writing and social studies and students maintained or exceeded the previous year's performance on TAKS in all but about one subgroup in social studies and writing and two subgroups in science. Math and science and working with our disadvantaged students will continue to be a priority as will working to increase the number of students taking the rigorous AP courses and exams. The district is also focusing on ways to increase student performance on the SAT/ACT tests. In the work toward continuous improvement the district will target assessing and assimilating new students, increasing the number of students completing high school in four years and exploring the best strategies for ensuring student success toward their diploma.

Future Size of the DIT
Small groups discuss how the district should proceed as we become much larger. By law the makeup of the DIT has to be a majority teachers – two-thirds. Currently there is a member from each campus. In looking at other large districts, some maintain a rep from each school, others use a feeder system, some rotate representation, etc. The groups reported out and Dr. Nelson will be compiling the data.
