School District and Community

Frisco, Texas is one of the fastest growing communities in the United States. Frisco ISD is at the top of the fastest growing school districts in the state and nation growing by 10-30 percent annually the past 12 years. FISD ended the 2008-2009 school year with approximately 31,000 students. The district grew by a little more than 10 percent this year. As of October 1, 2009, there are 33,895 students enrolled.

Within the 75 square miles of our district, we serve residents of Collin and Denton Counties and residents of Frisco, and some portions of Plano, Little Elm, and McKinney. FISD is 30 miles north of Dallas. The district is about 48-50 percent built-out.

School

The fifth high school in FISD, Heritage High School opened in August, 2009 with freshman and sophomore classes.

Current student enrollment for all 2009-2010 is 633.

The school mascot is the Coyote (K-eye-oat).

Grading System

Class rank, cumulative from the beginning of ninth grade, is calculated from final semester averages. The grade average is based upon a 100 point scale for all courses. Rank in class, honor graduate classes, valedictorian and salutatorian determinations shall be based on a weighted grade point average (GPA system). Grade points shall be based on semester grades and shall be computed to three decimal places. Weighted grade points are awarded for some upper level courses, as well as for Pre-AP and AP courses.
