

CHS MEETS AYP

Per the Texas Education Agency, Centennial High School has met AYP (Average Yearly Progress) for the 2010-11 school year. AYP refers to the federally mandated accountability system requirements placed on public schools by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. In calculating AYP, federal entities and the TEA evaluate the participation percentage against the performance percentages of the six sub groups (African American, Hispanic, White, Economically Disadvantaged, Special Education and Limited English Proficient) that a school might have as said performances pertain to Reading/English Language Arts, Mathematics, Graduation Rate and/or Attendance Rate. AYP performance standards of 80% in Reading/ELA, 75% in Math and 90% in Completion/Graduation and Attendance Rates must be met by the students attending the respective public institution in order to attain recognition for having met AYP. Centennial High School students performed at a 98% met or exceeds rate in Reading/ELA, a 96% met or exceeds rate in Math and CHS had a Completion/Graduation rate of 99.4% coupled with a 96.7 % average daily attendance rate for 2010-11..

Centennial High School has exceeded AYP performance standards all six years that it has been eligible for evaluation of AYP. CONGRATULATIONS TITANS!
