TEA Exemplary Rating

Centennial High School was recognized as a Texas Education Association “Exemplary Campus” for the last three consecutive years for their exceptional efforts on the 36 criteria used to evaluate the effectiveness and success of Texas public schools. The Titans far surpassed the 90% level of expectation by the TEA in all 36 criteria to be considered an Exemplary campus. Centennial High School was the only large high school in the state of Texas *with a diverse student population* to have been so recognized.

After High School

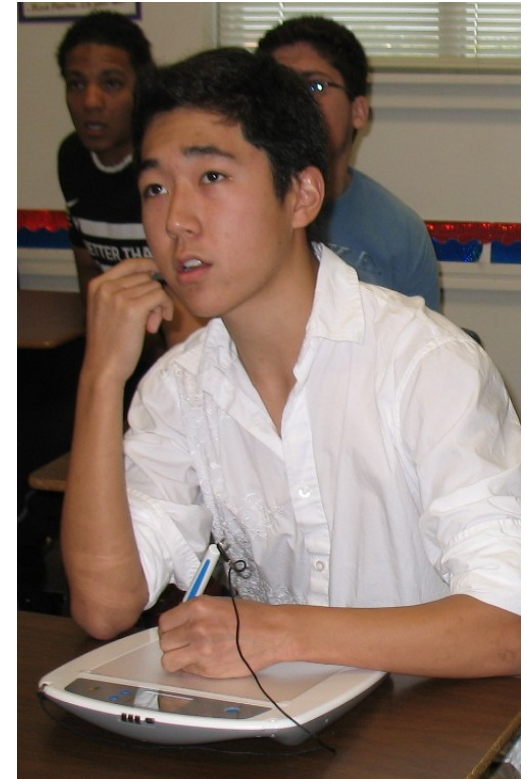
90% of Centennial Titan students are college-bound. Historically, approximately 55% of our student body will attend a four-year university and 35% will attend two-year schools. In addition, the senior class of 2011 earned scholarship offers totaling more than \$9 million dollars. Last, in 2011, 78% of our students who took an Advanced Placement College Board exam earned a 3 or better on their exam, which could entitle them to college credit in that course.
