SCHEDULING

Should I take Pre-AP/AP classes?

Obviously, this is a very individual decision, and there are many factors to take into consideration: areas of strengths, previous grades, other commitments, teacher recommendations, etc. Your current teacher knows your skill set the best. They will be the best judge of your academic readiness. Taking all Pre-AP in all areas is very challenging and time consuming, especially for those who have extracurricular commitments. Please know very few students can juggle this load well. We encourage you to balance your life and your school load. Students who decide to take Pre-AP classes are required to complete the entire first 6 weeks of the class before a move to regular level would be considered.

Can I play multiple sports at CHS?

Yes, however, only the sport that occurs first will appear on your schedule. It is important to discuss your plans with your coaches because some sports' seasons overlap quite a bit, making it very difficult to participate in both.

Should I sign up for athletics?

Anyone can sign up, but you must make the team in order to stay in the class. Our athletic programs are competitive and not designed to teach a student the sport; students are already expected to have experience and skills. Students who do not make the team are removed from the class and then placed into PE and/or alternates from their schedule card. If this happens, you might get switched to new teachers and even a new lunch assignment. This occurs around week two of the semester.

Can I request a particular teacher/period/lunch?

We do not honor requests for certain teachers, class periods, or lunches.

Who is eligible for Late Arrival/Early Release?

Juniors and seniors who are on track with their credits, have passed the state exams, have parent permission, and who have transportation at the appropriate times may request late arrival or early release. Students should be aware that this may impact the other courses available to them and that selective colleges do not look favorably upon this option.

How can I be a teacher or office aide?

Juniors and seniors, who are on track with their credits, have passed their state exams and who have parent and staff permission may request to be a teacher or office aide. It is the student's responsibility to seek out a staff member who needs them as an aide.

Can I be in the band and also in athletics?

Maybe. You need to consult with both the band director and the coach of the sport you wish to play. It is very time consuming to do both of these activities. While it might be allowed, it will be a challenge.

Can I take classes at the CTE Center?

There are a couple of classes open to 9th graders at the CTE center. These are noted on the back of your schedule card. Transportation is provided. Many CTE classes have prerequisites so be sure to check the course catalogue to see if you are eligible. The course catalogue is posted to the CHS home page.

How does the A/B block work?

We have a total of 8 classes. Four classes meet each day for an hour and a half each; the next day, four different classes meet. The first four classes are 'A' day, the second four classes are 'B' day, and they alternate all year long.

Can I change my mind and change my schedule after I turn in my card?

You can make any changes you need to up until our final schedule verification. In April, you will be mailed a copy of the courses we have entered for you at CHS. If your courses are entered correctly, you will not need to return the verification form. If there is an error, or you have changed your mind, you have until May 11th to return the verification form to CHS and make any changes you wish. After May 11th, elective choices cannot be changed. Remember that once school begins, students who have signed up for Pre-AP classes will be required to complete the first six weeks before a move to regular will be considered. Students who wish to move to regular level at the close of the first six weeks will need the permission of the teacher, parent, and counselor.

Can you explain the PE options at CHS?

There are several classes that count for PE. You can take a PE class. You have 4 choices under the PE option: Aerobics, Team & Individual Sports (various sports you play for fun like volleyball, tennis, basketball, golf), Weightlifting, and Personal Fitness (healthy living). Each of these classes lasts for the full year. It is allowable to pick two of these classes and take one course for first term and a different PE course for the next term. If you do not take PE class, you can take one of the following instead: band, dance class, color guard, athletics, and drill team. Anyone can sign up for dance class, but the rest of these require a try out or approval of the instructor. Go ahead and sign up and then the try out will happen once you are at CHS. Band students should contact Mr. Centera for more information about band. Cheerleaders also earn PE credit in the fall semester for cheer.

One technology class is required to graduate. Can you tell me which classes will count for my technology credit?

Business Information Management (BIM), Digital & Interactive Media (DIM), Broadcast TV, Computer Maintenance, Computer Science, Yearbook 2, Web Technologies, and Digital Graphics & Animation. Not all of these are open to 9th graders. Check your schedule card or the course guide to see if 9th graders can enroll. Keyboarding (Touch Systems Data) taught at the middle schools does count for elective credit in high school, but it does not count as a technology credit towards graduation. You must take one of the courses listed above.

One fine art credit is required to graduate. Can you tell me which classes will count for my fine art credit?

Art, theater, technical theater, choir, band, dance, orchestra, and Elements of Floral Design all count as a fine art credit towards graduation.

What classes at the middle school level count toward high school for graduation?

The 2 year Spanish program at the middle school gives you credit for Spanish 1 at the high school. Students who took this should sign up for Spanish 2. Other high school credits include Algebra in 8th grade and health.

ACADEMICS

How can I find my GPA?

Weighted GPAs are calculated and posted to Family Connection. An email will go out once rank has been updated. Occasionally, seniors will need to know their unweighted GPA for a scholarship or college application. Please contact your counselor for this information. Both types of GPA appear on the transcripts we send to colleges.

What is the difference between weighted and unweighted GPA?

The weighted GPA gives extra point value for the PAP, AP, and dual credit classes. CHS uses a 5.0 weighted GPA system. This is how we determine your class rank, Valedictorian, Salutatorian, and honor grads. Unweighted GPA is figured on a college 4.0 system, and sometimes out of state colleges ask that your GPA be converted to the 4.0 system. The GPA point conversion chart is located in the Academic Guide on our web site.

Can I take classes in the summer?

Yes, you can take health, communications applications (speech) or Business Information Management (Office Word, Excel, PowerPoint). These are the only classes offered in summer school for advancement (to get ahead). Summer school dates are not yet available. There are two sessions of summer school. You can only take one class each session of summer school. Each session lasts approximately 3 weeks, and each session costs approximately \$250. If you take BIM, you will need to take both sessions of summer school as the course lasts for two terms. Summer school dates and summer school location will be available on the website in May. All other classes taught in summer school are only open to students who need to repeat the class due to failure.
