



The Juvenile Impact Program offers an alternative that brings parents and youth together at a time when that relationship may be strained. Together, the family unit is informed about consequences and youth are empowered with information and support to help them move away from delinquent conduct before incarceration may be warranted. This hands-on interaction with the youth and parents reinforces the police department's commitment to the community.

The Juvenile Impact Program educates juveniles and their parents about the possible consequences of delinquent conduct through presentations by law enforcement and juvenile justice personnel as well as first hand accounts of youths incarcerated in a Texas Youth Commission (TYC) Halfway House. The program targets youths between the ages of 10 and 18 that have been moved into the criminal justice system, most commonly for truancy, theft, and disorderly conduct offenses.

The program is available not only to court-ordered participants, but to any family concerned about a child's conduct.

The program is available twice monthly on Monday evenings at the Frisco Police Department. There is no charge.
