

Collection Development, **Evaluation & Assessment for Library Materials**

Collection development involves the identification, selection, acquisition, and evaluation of a collection of library resources to fit the needs of its users and potential users.

The primary objective of instructional resources selected for the library media center are to support, enrich, and assist in implementing the FISD's educational program.

Resources selected shall:

- · Enrich and support the curriculum, taking into consideration students' varied interests, abilities, learning styles, and maturity levels.
- Stimulate growth in factual knowledge, literary appreciation, aesthetic values, and societal standards.
- Present various sides of controversial issues so that students have an opportunity to develop, under guidance, skills in critical analysis and in making informed judgments in their daily lives.
- Represent many religious, ethnic, and cultural groups and their contributions to the national heritage and world community.

Collection development involves the identification, selection, acquisition, and evaluation of a collection of library resources to fit the needs of its users and potential users. The following criteria is in alignment with our EF(Local) policy.

Book Selection Criteria

Material in the library must meet the criteria below:

Objective	Purpose
Alignment	 A review must include at least one grade level served by the purchasing campus. Elementary - reviewed for grades PK-5; use caution when considering books reviewed for grades 5-8; book coded YA may not be added. Middle School - reviewed for grades 6-8 or below; use caution with reviews for grades 7-12. High School - reviewed for grades 9-12 or below; use caution when reviews state "explicit" or "mature" material. Books coded as AD (craft or other non-fiction) should be carefully considered prior to adding to secondary collections. The age of the main character(s) is a good guideline for determining target audience.

Takeaways for Further Updating Guidelines

Removal of Kirkus Reviews as an acceptable publisher

Include one two reviews rather than one-one can be informal

Sophistication Objective: How is engagement determined, i.e. circulation numbers, popular recommendations, student requests.

Important to include titles that are reflective of societal issues.



Further define Manga rating terms for secondary libraries

Defining the term sexually explicit by using Texas Penal Code in definitions of guidelines.
